Nira Cooray, MS, MPH, CIH, CSP Apex Environmental Safety & Health

Nira Cooray is a safety and health professional who has helped Hawaii's employees work safely and help preserve the health of Hawaii's workforce for over thirty years. In 2011 she founded Apex Environmental Safety and Health, a consulting firm that provides ongoing health and safety support to business owners in construction, and General Industry. Prior to starting Apex, Nira was a senior consultant at Bureau Veritas, where she managed a portfolio of clients and provided them with environmental safety and health consulting services, that included industrial hygiene assessments, health and safety training, ergonomic assessments, health and safety audits and the preparation health and safety plans and other programs required by U.S. OSHA regulations. She began her career at the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations in Hawaii as an Environmental Health Specialist at Hawaii Occupational Safety and Health Division (HIOSH), and she received a Superior Performance Award in 1994 for her work in enforcement of Occupational Health Regulations. She also worked as an OSH advisor with the HIOSH where she provided outreach in health and safety to small businesses. She was an instructor for the industrial hygiene courses at Honolulu Community College, Occupational Environmental Safety Management Program for nearly 20 years.



Additional experience includes: conducting and/or supervising the delivery of safety programs and orientations to site personnel; implementing and supervising safety, environmental, accident and fire protection programs in compliance with federal and state regulations; implements and monitors PSI programs, coordinates the investigation of incident reporting and field construction activities inspections; and clearly demonstrates a strong commitment to HSEpolicies and the goal for zero incidents.


Mary Silva, CSP SPY 2021

Mary has 30+ years of extensive experience in the safety and health profession. She has provided EHS leadership, support and consultation across several industries including property and casualty insurance risk control, construction, telecommunications, oil & gas downstream operations.

Several of the notable achievements Mary has achieved in the recent past was assist a client in reducing theirworkers' compensation premium by \$250,000 over two policy periods. She was integrally involved in revamping the entire safety program including accountability aspects for executive management. She helped develop, write, and implement this program with an insured with 200+ employees over 6 sites across Oahu.

She is also most proud of significantly reducing the workers' compensation severity rates while she was at Castle & Cooke Homes Hawaii, Inc.

(CCHHI) Because they were an Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP), the insurance cost for the construction projects were bottom line costs/profits for CCHHI. When she started at CCHHI, the workers' compensation cost per hour worked on the projects were \$2+. By 2007, the cost per hour worked was \$0.08, an over 90% reduction in cost. Frequency went from 123 to 14 in that timeframe. That year CCHHI was awarded the National Association of Homebuilder's Association (NAHB) Safe Builder of the Year Award and Mary was named the NAHB Safety Professional of the Year Award.



Adam Cotton, CSP, CHST SPY 2022

Adam is the Director of Safety and Health for Hensel Phelps Construction and oversees the safety and health of all operations in the Pacific Region.He directly leads and supervises 14 safety professionals located in Hawaii and Guam.He manages and administers the Company's Safety and Health Program, Risk Management and Loss Control Programs, general liability, auto claims, workers' compensation for 200 craft employeesperforming self-work, and over 200 salary employees in managerial positions.

During the last three years, Adam led Hensel Phelps in reducing recordable accidents by 100%.

There were zero recordable mishaps in 2021 with over 650,000 worker hours) by surrounding himself with an outstanding staff of safety professionals and assisting/mentoring frontline workers to create a culture that focuses on safety.

Adam has been on the local chapter ASSP Executive committee for the last six years as a Delegate and Member at Large. He has been part of the ASSP PACRIM Seminar PlanningCommittee for the previous four years and specifically focused on getting our sponsors to fund the event.

Safety Fest originated in Denver CO, in 2005 when the OSHA Regional office collaborated with several professional construction associations, an insurance company and the Colorado State University OSHA consultation project, to address fall protection issues in the construction industry. The event was named Safety Fest of the West. This event has since evolved and continues in the Denver area today. 
Volunteer Opportunities
